1. What is the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)?

The GDPR is a new European privacy law that goes into effect on the 25th of May. The purpose of the GDPR is to have the same data protection laws across all EU member states and give its citizens more control over how and when their data is used. Curve Creative Freelance Design does not share any information that you have provided unless you have made such a request. Curve Creative Freelance Design has not need or intention of sharing your information in any capacity. It is stored to identify potential and current clients.

6. What Cookies do you store?

None. This is a portfolio website used to advertise services that are provided to the general public. There is no need for this website to collect information on you, in any way or form. The Cookie Law is a piece of privacy legislation that requires websites to get consent from visitors to store or retrieve any information on a computer, smartphone or tablet. You do not enter any information into this website, therefore nothing needs to be recorded.
